Guidance notes:

- 1. This form can be used to apply for **conversion** of an existing permit issued under section 34 of the Gaming Act 1968, or to apply for a **grant** or **renewal** of a unlicensed family entertainment centre gaming machine permit under the Gambling Act 2005 or to **change the name of the holder** of such a permit.
- 2. A permit cannot be transferred. A change of name is only permitted where the permit holder changes his / her name or wishes to be known by another name.
- 3. An unlicensed family entertainment centre is entitled to provide an unlimited number of category D gaming machines available for use on the premises, i.e. those with a maximum stake of 10p / maximum prize of £5.00 or maximum stake of 30p / maximum prize of £8.00
- 4. No other category of gaming machine may be made available.
- 5. The permit's duration is 10 years. A renewal application must be made 2-6 months before the expiry date of the permit (Schedule 10 paragraph 18 Gambling Act 2005).
- 6. The fee for conversion of an existing Section 34 permit is £100, for grant or renewal of a new family entertainment centre permit is £300 and for a change of name is £25.
- 7. Applicants should be aware that this Licensing Authority has published a 'Statement of Principles' under Schedule 10 paragraph of the Gambling Act 2005. The Statement of Principles is contained within the authority's Statement of Licensing Policy (Gambling Act 2005) which can be viewed via this authority's website or at the council's offices at 3 19 South Street, Rochford, SS4 1BW during normal working hours.
- 8. The licensing authority must notify the applicant of its grant / refusal of the application for a permit as soon as is reasonably practicable after that decision to grant / refuse has been made.
