In accordance with Regulations 26 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 notice is hereby given that Rochford District Council adopted the Allocations Plan at a meeting of Council on 25 February 2014.

The Allocations Plan sits below the Core Strategy in the Council's development plan and sets out specific sites for different land uses, including residential and employment development. It covers the whole of the District.

The Allocations Plan was subject to independent examination by a Planning Inspector. The Inspector found the Allocations Plan to be sound, subject to a number of modifications pursuant to Section 23 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. These modifications are set out in the Inspector's Report, and were made to the Allocations Plan prior to its adoption.

Any person aggrieved by the Allocations Plan may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that the plan is not within the appropriate powers and/or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made promptly, and in any event, no later than Tuesday 8 April 2014 (6 weeks after the date of adoption specified above).
