

Stambridge Overview

- Total Population of the Parish is 700
 - An increase from 696 in 2001
 - Population density of 1.27 people per hectare (ppha), much lower than the Rochford average of 4.9 ppha
- The average age of a Stambridge resident is 43.5 years, higher than the national average of 39.3 years
- Between 2001 and 2011, the number of dwellings in the Parish has slightly increased from 253 to 257





Paglesham Overview

- Total Population of the Parish is 246
 - A slight decrease from 249 in 2001
 - Population density of 0.3 people per hectare (ppha), much lower than the Rochford average of 4.9 ppha
- The average age of a Paglesham resident is 44 years, higher than the national average of 39.3 years
- Between 2001 and 2011, the number of dwellings in the Parish has slightly increased from 108 to 110





Education Overview

- 1 School in Stambridge Parish:
 - Stambridge Primary Academy
 - Capacity in 2014/15 = 84
 - Number of students in 2014/15 = 60
 - The school currently has a surplus of capacity of 24 students
 - Projected Capacity in 2019/20 = 84
 - Projected number of students in 2019/20 = 67
 - The school is projected to have a slightly decreased surplus of capacity of 17 students by 2020

Business Overview

- Within Stambridge Parish there are 23 rating assessed businesses.
- Paglesham has 7 rating assessed businesses.
- Stambridge and Paglesham Parishes have a mix of business uses, for example; Offices, Retail, Workshops etc.
 - Are there any attractive business uses missing?
 - What can be done to attract these kind of businesses?





Infrastructure Overview

- Public Transport provision:
 - Bus services numbers 60, 60A, 515, 806 run to Stambridge and Paglesham, travelling to Rochford and Southend
 - Car use remains high
- Utilities
 - Generally available across the Parish however more rural areas may not have access
- Broadband is available across the majority of the Parish
 - Standard Broadband Speed is advertised as up to 17mbps, however the estimated speed is 1.5mbps, lower than the district average
 - Maximum advertised Fibre speed (where available) is 52 mbps, lower than the 76mbps advertised for the district. Speeds in reality will be much lower and vary by location.
 - SuperFast Essex has identified an area covering the majority of the Stambridge Parish and within the built up areas in Paglesham, which are scheduled for an upgrade to their Fibre Broadband, due between June 2017 to July 2018





Health Overview

- Stambridge and Paglesham residents currently have to leave their parish to access a General Practitioner
- 80% of Stambridge residents would rate their general health as being 'good' to 'very good'¹
 - This is up from 61% in 2001
- 89% of Paglesham residents would rate their general health as being 'good' to 'very good'¹
 - This is up from 78% in 2001
 - Both Parishes are higher than the national average of 81%

Conservation and Culture

- Stambridge and Paglesham have a number of listed buildings which are of high priority to preserve.
- ☐ Grade II*
 - Church of St Mary and All Saints (Stambridge)
 - ☐ Church of St Peter (Paglesham)
- Grade II
 - There are 16 grade II listed buildings across Stambridge
 - ☐ A further 19 are located within Paglesham




